At the heart of United Way’s work is providing services that stabilize those who are vulnerable and unable to meet their most basic needs. The safety net includes everything from food and shelter to quality childcare and help escaping domestic violence. We know that before families can even think about the future, they must be able to meet their basic needs.

Additional Impact Areas



Mission United connects veterans, military and active duty members or family members with a caseworker who can help with emergency assistance, financial management, legal assistance with discharge and disability upgrades and other community resources.



United Way will invest in organizations, networks and programs that spark dialogue and action to improve equity in Brevard. United Way has been leading efforts by conducting Equity Forums in Education, Health, and Social Justice. These forums are a coordinated series of discussions with community leaders that start with local data and allow open conversations. The objective is to identify priority areas where we as a community can improve equity and inclusion.

How does United Way determine which programs are vital to supporting our community’s needs?

When you give to the Community Care Fund nearly 75 volunteers spend over 1,000 hours to help determine how to meet a broad array of needs supported by both our Safety Net Services and Targeted Care.

The allocations process is an annual certification designed to give donors peace of mind that their money is being put to the best possible use in Brevard. Programs that comply with these standards have provided documentation that they meet standards in governance, operations and support to the community.
